
Later on in the term, Key Stage two children will be sitting assessment tests to check their attainment and progress. Please support your children in completing these as they provide an important opportunity to practice and embed new learning and can deepen understanding. They also give families a chance to talk about the learning that is taking place in school.

It is very important that your child reads every day. Please remember to sign your child's book when you have listened to them read. Your child will have a reading book from school that is pitched at a level to help develop their reading. The children can also take home another book of their choice. Please read this with your child as well.







Year 6

Welcome back to a very exciting final term in primary school! We will be continuing with our learning around WW2 with a trip to Hughenden Manor on Friday 17th May to explore the impact of this event on the local area. This theme runs through computing where we continue to look at the work of Bletchley Park and our first reading text where we will be reading a biography on Alan Turing.

For our second text of this half term, we will read Brightstorm, by Vashti Hardy, a story of two twins whose world is turned upside down and end up on a mission to South Polaris to restore the Brightstorm name. There are many parallels between this text and others that your children may enjoy reading, such as A Series of Unfortunate Events and Northern Lights.

In our writing lessons, we will be doing 3 independent pieces of writing to consolidate our learning from across the year: a newspaper report on The Blitz, a balanced argument on dams and a biography of Mary Anning. We will also be learning about Mary Anning in our science lessons where we look at evolution and inheritance.

In our geography lessons in Spring term, we were learning about North America. This half-term we build on this by looking at Buckinghamshire and California and how the two places compare.

PE continues to be on Monday and Thursday, but children may need PE kits on other days so it should be brought in to school Monday and returned home on Friday to be washed. PE is OAA (outdoor adventurous activities) and cricket.
