Reading

It is very important that your child reads every day. Please remember to sign your child's book when you have listened to them read. Your child will be able to change their reading book when they can demonstrate that they understand what they have read, this may be only once a week. The more times they read a book, the more fluent and confident they will be. The children can also take home another book of their choice. Please read this with your child as well.

Year 1

The children have come in to Year 1 eager to learn and explore, they have settled in well and are enjoying learning through play, while slowly being introduced to more formal lessons. The children have started their new phonics groups and are now taking home reading books linked to these groups. We have started using our numbers to 10 when counting and will soon start using them to add and subtract. We will be learning about seasonal changes in Science and will have the opportunity to explore autumnal colours and signs when we visit Wendover Woods this term.

We are very excited to follow StickMan's trail while we are there, which links to one of our stories this half term. In Geography we will discuss different weather patterns in the UK. For Art and D.T. we will be learning about the famous artist; Andy Goldsworthy and creating moving pictures.



Year 2

The children have returned to school looking very smart and ready to lean. We have lots to look forward to and are eager to get started. The children will have a Writing and Reading lesson daily. During our Maths lessons we will be focusing on place value and counting, then moving on to addition and subtraction. Our Science topic this half term is all about materials and their properties. The children will be taking part in lots of experiments to find out about different materials. Our Art lessons are based on the Pop Artist Andy Warhol. The children will be creating self-portraits in a Pop Art style. The children will have PE on Mondays and Fridays.

We are using the story of Jack and the Beanstalk as a stimulus for writing. We are learning the text by drawing story maps and using actions. We needed a giant from the story for our display so the children drew around Mr Kann! We are concentrating on writing in full sentences, with neat handwriting and correct punctuation.

Year 3

read to an adult every day at home.

Year 3 is already demonstrating their developing maturity and independence by getting used to a busy timetable and some challenging routines! Our reading text is called 'The Owl who was afraid of the dark' and our first writing text is a narrative about a superhero defeating a monster. In maths, we are focussing on place value up to 1000 and learning the 2,5,10 times tables off by heart. In science we will be exploring forces, such as magnetism and gravity and we will be creating self-portraits in art, inspired by Post-Impressionism and artists such as Vincent van Gogh.
