# Year 6

Welcome back to the final year of primary school for our Year 6's. The children have had a great start to the year and have hit the ground running, impressing all of the Year 6 team with their attitude and work ethic so far! Miss Price and Miss Chandler have been impressed with the maturity of the children and their "can do" attitude which was clearly evident when sitting their 11+ papers.

We have extremely high expectations of the children in Year 6, as we prepare them for their journey to secondary school. Please ensure children are coming into school with a full correct uniform and PE kit. As we are preparing children for life beyond primary school, the homework they are expected to complete each night has increased from Year 5. Children need to be completing both pieces of maths homework each night, as well as their reading, SPaG and spelling. Getting in a good routine will help them massively throughout the year.

We have begun to teach the Year 6 curriculum and we have been impressed with the children's SPaG skills in writing. We will move on to using these SPaG skills in 2 different writing pieces this half term based on the books we are reading Floodland and Kensuke's Kingdom. We look forward to seeing what the children produce. In maths, we have started with number and place value and will be moving on to securing our knowledge of the four operations. The children have had the opportunity to make their own electrical circuits this week and we are very interested in seeing what they can create as we learn more about electricity.

We have jumped right into our Geography topic of rivers with having a drama afternoon. The children were very engaged coming up with their own sounds and actions to represent a river. As the afternoon went on, they became more confident and we saw them creating freeze frames and mini performances to act out uses of a river and the water cycle. We hope this drama afternoon will deepen their understanding as we dive into the topic. The children have been showing off their gymnastic skills already, revisiting their learning of key moves and practising the different rolls, ask your child so that they can show you at home. We will be practising our portrait skills in art this half term, creating them in the style of M C Escher and we can't wait to put them on display.
