noun	A word for a person, place, or thing.
noun phrases	Tells you more about a noun. (very old grandma)
statement	A sentence that states a fact. (It is sunny today.) 
question	A sentence to find out information. (What is your name?) 
exclamation	A word or phrase expressing emotion. (What a scary movie it was!) 
command	A sentence that tells you to do something. (Put on your coat.)
compound	Two words put together to make a new word. (white + board = whiteboard)
suffix	Group of letters added to the end of a word. (s, es, est, er, ing, ed, ly)
adjective	A word used to describe a noun. (tall, beautiful)
adverb	A word that describes a verb. (quickly, quietly, slowly)
tense	Tells us when an action took place. (Present = walking, past = walked)
